Direction determines destination. This means that where you are headed is where you will arrive, if you don't get lost along the way.


Below you will see our "rough" plans for moving ahead in three vital areas.

  - June 16: Church Conference @ 7:00 PM details to come later
  - Receive recommendations for potential team members. (Lay Leadership)
  - Interview interested parties. (Lay Leadership Team)
  - July: Prayer about who should be on the team.
  - August: choose new Leadership Team candidates for Church Conference approval.
  - Fall Church Conference: vote on the new Leadership Team and more training
  - October thru December: Train new Leadership Team and anyone interested.
  - January 2022: Transition to new Leadership Single Board Governance Model





### Single Board Governance

The Single Governance Board task force has been meeting regularly and has presented to Church Council the final draft of "Leadership Team Guiding Principles". The document has received Church Council approval. The Single Board Governance model would replace the Church Council/Administrative Board model. If approved by Church Conference, the name will be changed from Church Council to Leadership Team.

The document is based on the premise Howell FUMC believes every person deserves to be welcomed as a cherished part of a community. The entire document will be available for review in the church library or electronically from the church office.

The Guiding Principles as approved by Church Council are organized in four distinct parts:

### I. Ministry Principles

The section begins with a comprehensive guiding statement that is externally focused and mission driven and contains the following elements:

- Seeking the unchurched
- Nurturing disciples
- Transforming the world

Ministry principles describe Ministry Teams that will be responsible for implementing the church's vision and mission. A list of ministries will be maintained which will include the goals and benefits each team is expected to accomplish in meeting the vision and mission of the church.

### **II. Boundary Principles**

The section includes the following:

- Ethical and biblical integrity statements
- Financial stewardship accountability and reporting requirements
- Relationship expectations between the Pastor, congregation and staff
- Safe sanctuary, staff hiring and termination standards
- Pastor and Leadership Team relations accountability
- Future Pastor succession

### III. Accountability Principles

Accountability Principles spell out the Leadership Team Code of Conduct and the disciplining process for the Leadership Team. Monitoring the performance of the Pastor is also an important part of this section.

In this model the Pastor is considered the Chief Operation Officer while the Leadership Team is considered the Board of Directors.

The Leadership Team will be made up of seven to nine members approved by Church Conference. Roles within the Leadership Team are established each year. One person may have more than one role. The roles are as follows:

- Chairperson
- Vice Chair
- Recording Secretary
- Lay Leader
- Trustee
- Staff Parish Relations
- Finance

The use of sub teams under the auspices of the Leadership Team are provided for. The sub teams will reinforce the work of the Leadership Team but never interfere with the delegation from the Leadership Team to the Pastor or with the work of staff.

### IV. Organizational Principles

Jesus Christ is the head of the church, and the church is the Body of Christ.

The Leadership Team assumes and performs all duties and functions of the Administrative Council as spelled out in the Book of Discipline for the United Methodist Church.

The role of the Leadership Team, eligibility to become a Leadership Team member, voting requirements, and removal from the Leadership Team are all spelled out in this section. Term limits and staggered terms are provided for.

The Guiding Principles document contains the following Appendices:

- Leadership Team Covenant
- Leadership Team Candidate Application

You will learn more in upcoming worship services and at a Town Hall meeting scheduled for May 26. There will be a special Church Conference to vote on the plan to be held in the month of June.

We are a third of the way thru the year but our Financial reporting only covers a fourth of the year.
