
When it comes to 2020, I'm over it! My prayer is that in 2021 we will move from Almost to Done in the things that matter most.

SINGLE BOARD GOVERNANCE

The Vital Church Imitative (VCI) produced a ministry plan that was approved by Church Conference. The Ministry Plans (1 D) included a change to a streamlined Church Council structure. This involved the formation of a task force on how to best move forward. The task force has met several times prior to the pandemic but the effort was placed on hold until now.

Focusing on the organizational structure of a church seems on the surface unspiritual. However, looking at a church's structure is spiritual for several reasons. The most important is it either allows for or prohibits the growth of a church, thus making fewer disciples of Christ. A bureaucracy that is too complex does not allow a church to move efficiently through the process of making decisions. Ministry isn't about governance; it's about making disciples of Jesus Christ.

The idea of Single Governance is to flatten the structure so we can get closer to the ministries of the church. The ministries being what our congregation thinks is best for our community.

The General Fund giving for 2020 was below what was needed to maintain a balanced budget. As you can see from above, the Pledged giving was running about 5 percent below where it needed to be and unpledged giving was about 40 percent below what it needed to be. The Payroll Protection Loan we received from the Small Business Administration helped us get by for this year but 2021 is the start of a new year.



New Year's Tea



The truck was packed full to the top of the topper, with an additional large box in the cab! Our delivery totaled 1,302 pounds, bringing out 2020 total to 2,103.5 pounds. The need is so great with all the suffering during the Covid-19 pandemic. A text from the Gleaners manager says it all: "Your church ROCKS!" Thank you to you all.

In 2019 we delivered 23 trips. In 2020 we delivered 8 trips with just under a 100 pounds less than in 2019!

Missions Report

In this very strange year of a world-wide pandemic, First United Methodist Church of Howell has adapted in so many ways. It's almost impossible to imagine it, had we not actually lived through it.

The Missions Committee saw many of the projects that we typically support be curtailed; no adult mission trip, no CROP walk, limited opportunities to collect food and donations for Gleaners. But, in spite of the challenges, the HEART of this church beats strong and together, we were able to accomplish much.

- Giving Garden The faithful gardeners produced and donated more than 1,800 pounds of fresh produce to Gleaners - feeding our neighbors. They also collected nearly \$2,000 in donations for Gleaners.
- Lenten Offering \$1,560 to Gleaners, \$1,560 to The Salvation Army and \$1,730 to Haitian Artisans for Peace International
- Advent Offering Your giving in 2020 will support LACASA (Livingston Area Council Against Spousal Abuse), United Methodist Retirement Communities and Carolina Honduras Health Foundations.
- Laundry Gap We continue to partner with Love In the Name of Christ and serve neighbors in need of laundry services. In 2020, 50 families with 98 family members were served with \$1,960 in vouchers for use at Wash Tubs laundromat.
- Gleaners We supported Gleaners with collected food (including the December 12 drive through food collection) and donated a total of 2,103 pounds of food and financial support of \$2,451 in adding to the funds provided from the Lenten offering and Giving Garden donations.
- Salvation Army Angel Tree Program So many of you stepped up to take a tag or purchase a gift from the Amazon Wishlist. All together, we donated more than 75 gifts for needy children in Livingston County.
- Salvation Army Bell Ringing Friday, December 18, sixteen volunteers participated in ringing all day at Kroger for the Salvation Army Keddle Drive

We hope that the reality of a vaccine for COVID-19 will allow us to be together again at some point in 2021. Until then, remember you can continue to support the work of the church through your giving and participation!
